- I. Minutes-
 - a. Approved.
- II. Course Proposal from Alison Wolf.
 - a. Concern about this coming from the Philosophy Department since it is a culture studies course or a history course. Perhaps it needs to come from another department.
 - b. Has this course been taught before? Normally under the current curriculum, 190, 290 and 390s aren't given designations. If this has been taught before, why isn't it a regular course?
 - i. Proctor is interested in it bring based in history.
 - c. Send back to proposer and have it run through History or World Language and Culture. Why can't we teach this as a regular course?
 - i. It may be better to see if this has been taught before if we move it to a regular course.
 - d. Most 90s don't have a CS designation.
 - i. That may have been past practice but it is not law. Also, it has been done in the past and has been done even this year.
 - e. Perhaps we need more information about the course.
 - f. Move to send it back to the department for clarification. Approved to send back.
- III. Sample documents for designations (7 out of 14). Seeking EPCC approval to go up as EPCC approved samples. All have come through the department or program chair (approved by panel and department). Approved and posted as a sample for others. They won't go to faculty to vote yet but it gives the panels a guide. Some committees will go up without EPCC approval but they will be noted clearly as not EPCC approved samples.
