Kresge Hall

- See building floor plans for more precision.

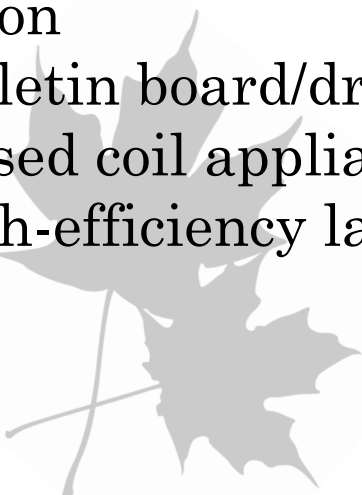

What To Bring With You

- Study lamps/floor lamp
- Radios/Stereos/MP3 players
- TV & DVD Player
- Computer
- Microwaves (have to be less than 1500 watts)
- Mini fridges (have to be less than 4.6 cubic ft)
- Power strips/surge protectors
- Your bike and lock
- Area rugs
- Posters, pictures, flags
- Plants
- A caddy for your toiletries
- Regular telephone (if desired)
- Futon
- Bulletin board/dry erase board
- Closed coil appliances
- High-efficiency laundry detergent



What NOT to Bring

- Microwaves larger than 1500 watts/2.0 cubic feet
- Refrigerators larger than 4.6 cubic feet
- Space heaters
- Window air conditioners
- Halogen lamps
- Alcohol/Drugs
- Open-coil electrical appliances (such as toasters, toaster ovens, hot plates)
- Live Christmas trees
- Candles
- Incense
- Weapons (knives, rifles, shotguns, handguns, air guns, bb guns, ammunition, firecrackers, etc.)
- Pets (except for fish in a 10 gallon or less tank)
- Extension cords

Community Advisors (On each floor)

One of the first people that you will meet on campus in the residence halls is the Community Advisor (CA). CAs are sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are here to make you feel at home. This team is your best and closest resource and can assist you in becoming successful in the residence hall and College community. CAs take part in the day-to-day activities of hall life and plan educational programs for their floor and for the entire hall. They can help you effectively work through problems that might arise with a roommate or hall neighbor and are trained to be good listeners when you just need someone to talk to.

Program Assistant (1 in Barker, 1 in Kresge)

The Program Assistant (PA) is a CA with that will also be responsible for holding events for both Barker and Kresge. These events will encompass educational and social opportunities for residents in the area.

Student Hall Coordinator (1 in Kresge)

The Student Hall Coordinator (SHC) lives in Kresge, but works with the Kresge and Barker CAs to hold bigger events and also works closely with the Area Coordinator. Additionally, this SHC advises the First-Year Council, which is a great opportunity for first-year residents to become involved!

Area Coordinator (1 for the Barker/Kresge area)

The Area Coordinators (ACs) are Master's level professionals who lives on campus. They oversee the hall/apartment where they live and other nearby residence hall(s) or buildings, particular programs, and their staff. They contribute to the design, implementation, and evaluation of the residence life program. Our ACs are a great resource to students and can assist you throughout your Simpson experience.
